

BEYOND DELAY UPDATE OF 2005-2006 LISTED MEMBERS

Members of the House

- Roy Blunt (R-MO)** *Beyond Delay 2005/2006* - Rep. Roy Blunt served as interim House Majority Leader in 2006 after Tom Delay resigned, but was unable to win the position permanently. Rep. Blunt continues to serve in the House of Representatives and is currently House Minority Whip.
- Ken Calvert (R-CA)** *Beyond Delay 2006* - Rep. Ken Calvert continues to be the focus of an FBI investigation and serves in the House of Representatives. Rep. Calvert is named once again in CREW's 2007 Beyond Delay report.
- Chris Cannon (R-UT)** *Beyond Delay 2006* - Rep. Chris Cannon was recently named in CREW's Family Affair report for paying six of his eight children from his campaign payroll, as well as having a brother who is a registered lobbyist. Rep. Cannon continues to serve in the House of Representatives.
- ★ **Randy "Duke" Cunningham (R-CA)** *Beyond Delay 2005* - On November 28, 2005, Rep. Randy "Duke" Cunningham resigned from the House of Representatives after pleading guilty to accepting at least \$2.4 million in bribes and underreporting his income for 2004. On March 3, 2006, Rep. Cunningham was sentenced to eight years and four months in prison and ordered to pay \$1.8 million in restitution. He began serving his time in prison on March 4, 2006 in Arizona.
- John Doolittle (R-CA)** *Beyond Delay 2006* - In April 2007, Rep. John Doolittle resigned his seat on the House Appropriations Committee following an FBI raid on his Virginia home. Rep. Doolittle continues to serve in the House of Representatives despite the ongoing federal investigation into his ties to lobbyist Jack Abramoff. Rep. Doolittle is named once again in CREW's 2007 Beyond Delay report.
- Tom Feeney (R-FL)** *Beyond Delay 2005/2006* - Rep. Tom Feeney is currently the subject of an FBI investigation into his dealings with convicted lobbyist Jack Abramoff. In January 2007, the House ethics committee found Rep. Feeney had inappropriately accepted a privately funded golf trip to Scotland, which had no connection to his official duties. Rep. Feeney has since created a legal defense fund and continues to serve in the House of Representatives. Rep. Feeney is named once again in CREW's 2007 Beyond Delay report.
- ★ **Katherine Harris (R-FL)** *Beyond Delay 2006* - In 2006, Rep. Katherine Harris decided not to run for re-election to her seat in the House of Representatives and instead ran for Senate in the state of Florida. She lost her bid for Senate on November 7, 2006 and is federal under investigation for her ties to convicted defense contractor Mitchell Wade.
- Dennis Hastert (R-IL)** *Beyond Delay 2006* - Rep. Dennis Hastert announced in August 2007 that he will not seek re-election in 2008.
- ★ **J.D. Hayworth (R-AZ)** *Beyond Delay 2006* - On November 7, 2006, Rep. J.D. Hayworth lost his re-election bid to his Democratic challenger, Harry Mitchell.
- William Jefferson (D-LA)** *Beyond Delay 2005/2006* - On June 4, 2006, Rep. William Jefferson was indicted on 16 counts related to corruption and bribery after an investigation by the FBI, which included raids on Rep. Jefferson's home and office. Investigators found \$90,000 in cash in Rep. Jefferson's freezer during the home raid. Despite the indictment, Rep. Jefferson continues to serve in the House of Representatives, having won re-election in November 2006. Rep. Jefferson is named once again in CREW's 2007 Beyond Delay report.
- Jerry Lewis (R-CA)** *Beyond Delay 2006* - Rep. Jerry Lewis is still under federal investigation for his ties to lobbyist Bill Lowery. Rep. Lewis continues to serve in the House of Representatives and is named once again in CREW's 2007 Beyond Delay report.
- Gary Miller (R-CA)** *Beyond Delay 2006* - Rep. Gary Miller is still under federal investigation for questionable land deals. Rep. Miller continues to serve in the House of Representatives and is named once again in CREW's 2007 Beyond Delay report.
- Alan Mollohan (D-WV)** *Beyond Delay 2006* - Rep. Alan Mollohan is the subject of an FBI investigation and continues to serve in the House of Representatives. He is chairman of an Appropriations subcommittee, although he has said he will recuse himself from any votes concerning the budget of the Justice Department. Rep. Mollohan is named once again in CREW's 2007 Beyond Delay report.
- John Murtha (D-PA)** *Beyond Delay 2006* - When the Democrats took control of the House of Representatives after the 2006 elections, Rep. John Murtha ran for House Majority Leader with the support of Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi, but was defeated, at least in part because of his ethics issues. He continues to serve in the House of Representatives and is currently Chair of the House Appropriations Defense Subcommittee. Rep. Murtha is once again named in CREW's 2007 Beyond Delay report.
- Marilyn Musgrave (R-CO)** *Beyond Delay 2005/2006* - Rep. Marilyn Musgrave continues to serve in the House of Representatives.

- ★ **Bob Ney (R-OH)** *Beyond Delay 2005* - On November 3, 2006, Rep. Bob Ney resigned from the House of Representatives after pleading guilty on September 14, 2006 to charges of conspiracy to defraud the United States and falsifying financial information on disclosure forms, both related to his association with Jack Abramoff. On January 17, 2007, Rep. Ney was sentenced to 30 months in prison. He began serving his time in prison on March 1, 2007 in West Virginia.
- ★ **Richard Pombo (R-CA)** *Beyond Delay 2005/2006* - On November 7, 2006, Rep. Richard Pombo lost his re-election bid to his Democratic challenger, Jerry McNerney.
- Rick Renzi (R-AZ)** *Beyond Delay 2005/2006* - Rep. Rick Renzi is currently the subject of an FBI investigation regarding an illicit land-swap deal. In August 2007, Rep. Renzi announced he will not seek re-election in 2008. Rep. Renzi is named once again in CREW's 2007 Beyond Delay report.
- Pete Sessions (R-TX)** *Beyond Delay 2006* - Rep. Pete Sessions continues to serve in the House of Representatives.
- ★ **Don Sherwood (R-PA)** *Beyond Delay 2006* - On November 7, 2006, Rep. Don Sherwood lost his re-election bid to his Democratic challenger, Chris Carney.
- ★ **John Sweeney (R-NY)** *Beyond Delay 2006* - On November 7, 2006, Rep. John Sweeney lost his re-election bid to his Democratic challenger, Kristen Gillibrand.
- ★ **Charles Taylor (R-NC)** *Beyond Delay 2005/2006* - On November 7, 2006, Rep. Charles Taylor lost his re-election bid to his Democratic challenger, Heath Shuler.
- Maxine Waters (D-CA)** *Beyond Delay 2005/2006* - Rep. Maxine Waters continues to serve in the House of Representatives.
- ★ **Curt Weldon (R-PA)** *Beyond Delay 2006* - On November 7, 2006, Rep. Curt Weldon lost his re-election bid to his Democratic challenger, Joe Sestak.

Members of the Senate

- ★ **Conrad Burns (R-MT)** *Beyond Delay 2005/2006* - On November 7, 2006, Sen. Conrad Burns lost his re-election bid to his Democratic challenger, Jon Tester.
- ★ **Bill Frist (R-TN)** *Beyond Delay 2005/2006* - Sen. Bill Frist is no longer a member of the Senate. He did not seek re-election in November 2006.
- ★ **Rick Santorum (R-PA)** *Beyond Delay 2005/2006* - On November 7, 2006, Rick Santorum lost his re-election bid to Democratic challenger Bob Casey.
